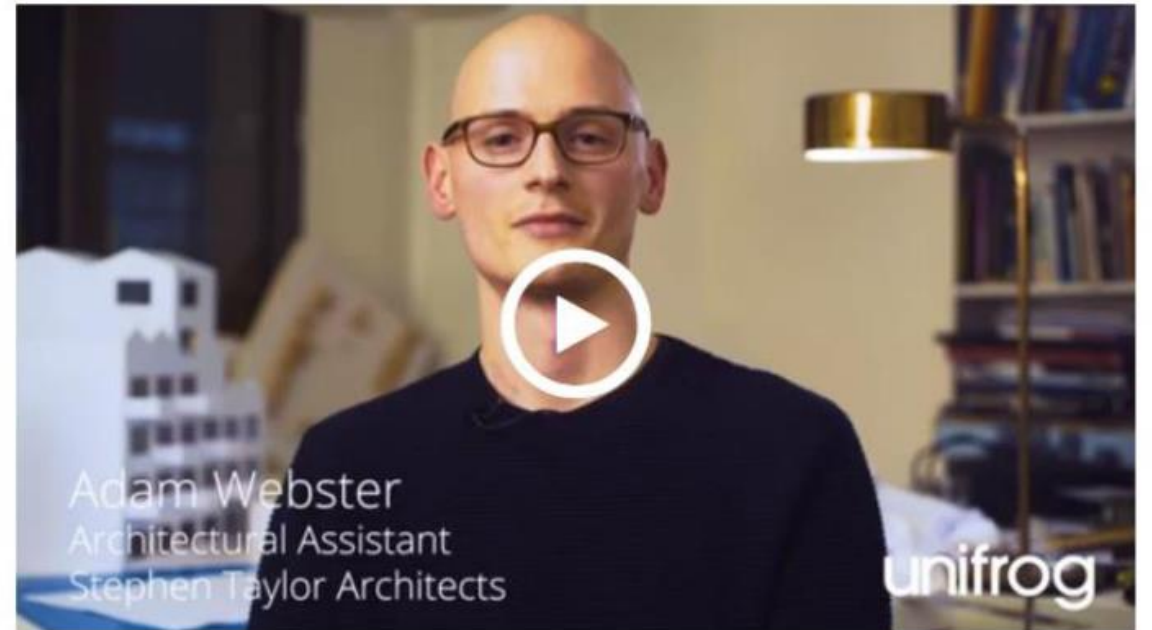


Architect
