Students are beginning their PSHE curriculum in lessons this term. I am writing to update you on the topics Year 12 will be studying in PSHE in the coming weeks. This half term, Year 12 will be focusing on **readiness for further study and the world of work** and will be taught:

- How to be enterprising in life and work
- Evaluating skills/strengths
- Getting the most out of 6th form life
- Study Skills/library resources
- How to make decisions about voting when you are 18
- Balancing work and study
- The rights and responsibilities in different types of employment, including full-time, part-time, and jobs in the 'gig economy'
- How to write an effective CV and prepare for interviews for part-time work
- How to demonstrate professional conduct, including following health and safety protocols
- Professional relationships; how to build meaningful relationships in the workplace and establish and respect boundaries
- Strategies for overcoming challenges or adversity in the workplace
- The role of trade unions and professional organisations
