

This is to improve their subject knowledge and vocabulary in preparation for the essay that accompanies their Personal Investigation. We will cover technical areas and creative techniques including the following:	This is the major project of A-Level Photography. It is worth 60% of the final grade and will be worked on until February of Year 13. For this project students will be completely independent with their choice of subject matter and technique choices, with guidance and advice from their teachers. They should draw on their strengths in Photography, what they enjoyed working on, what they would like to investigate more, and on other photography experiences to help them decide on the subject matter for this project. There is an essay element of the personal investigation that is between 1000-3000 words.
